Spray Adhesive (M103-0195)

We are pleased to announce a new high performance formula for our Spray Adhesive (M103-0195). In addition to being high performance the new formula does not contain any methylene chloride. Methylene chloride is a solvent that many customers are now trying to avoid. The new formula also meets Federal and State VOC requirements.

 - On porous materials such as urethane and rubber foam, upholstery and fabrics - coat both surfaces with adhesives. Join materials when surfaces become tacky to touch.
 - On non-porous materials such as wood, plastics and leather - coat only one surface with adhesive. Press surfaces together when adhesive is tacky to the touch.
 - **For Temporary Bonds:**
 - Apply light coat to one surface only. Allow three minutes to dry before joining. Material can be separated when desired without transfer.

Butane Burn-In Knife (M900-3210)

Do you ever need to make a quick burn-in repair? With Mohawk's Butane Burn-In Knife (M900-3210) you can make repairs in the field or in the shop without the hassle of an extension cord.



In addition, there is no guesswork

needed to distinguish how much butane you have because the level is always visible. The temperature range enables a fast heat-up time and maintains proper burn-in temperature with adequate adjustments. Use the medium heat range for performing burn-ins in wood, and high heat for curing our Leather/Vinyl Repair Heat Cure Compound (M872-6804). The knife comes with a built-in stand. Just make sure to rest it on a heatproof and insulated surface.
